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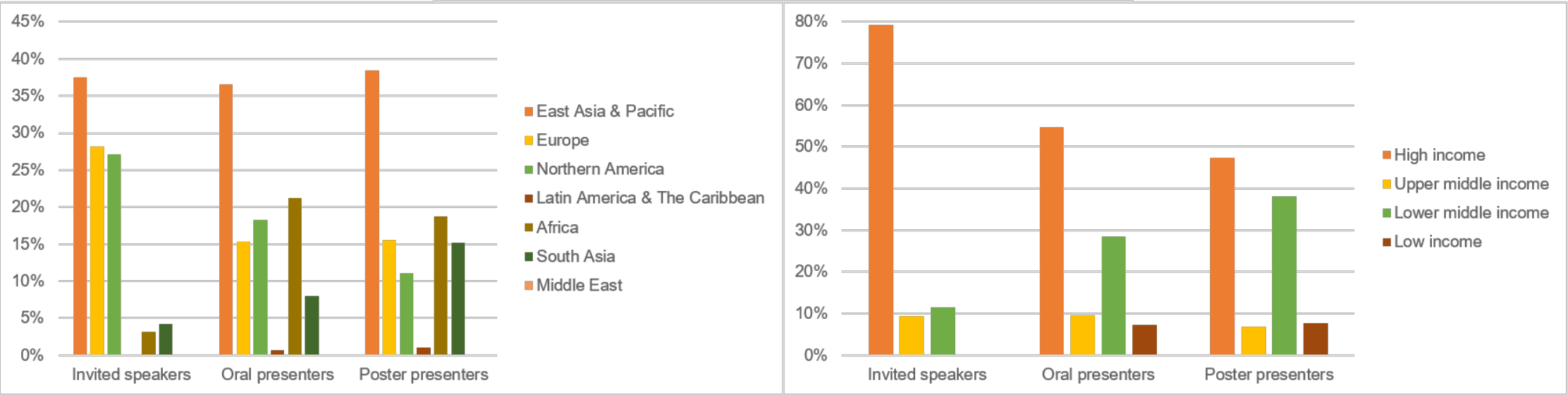
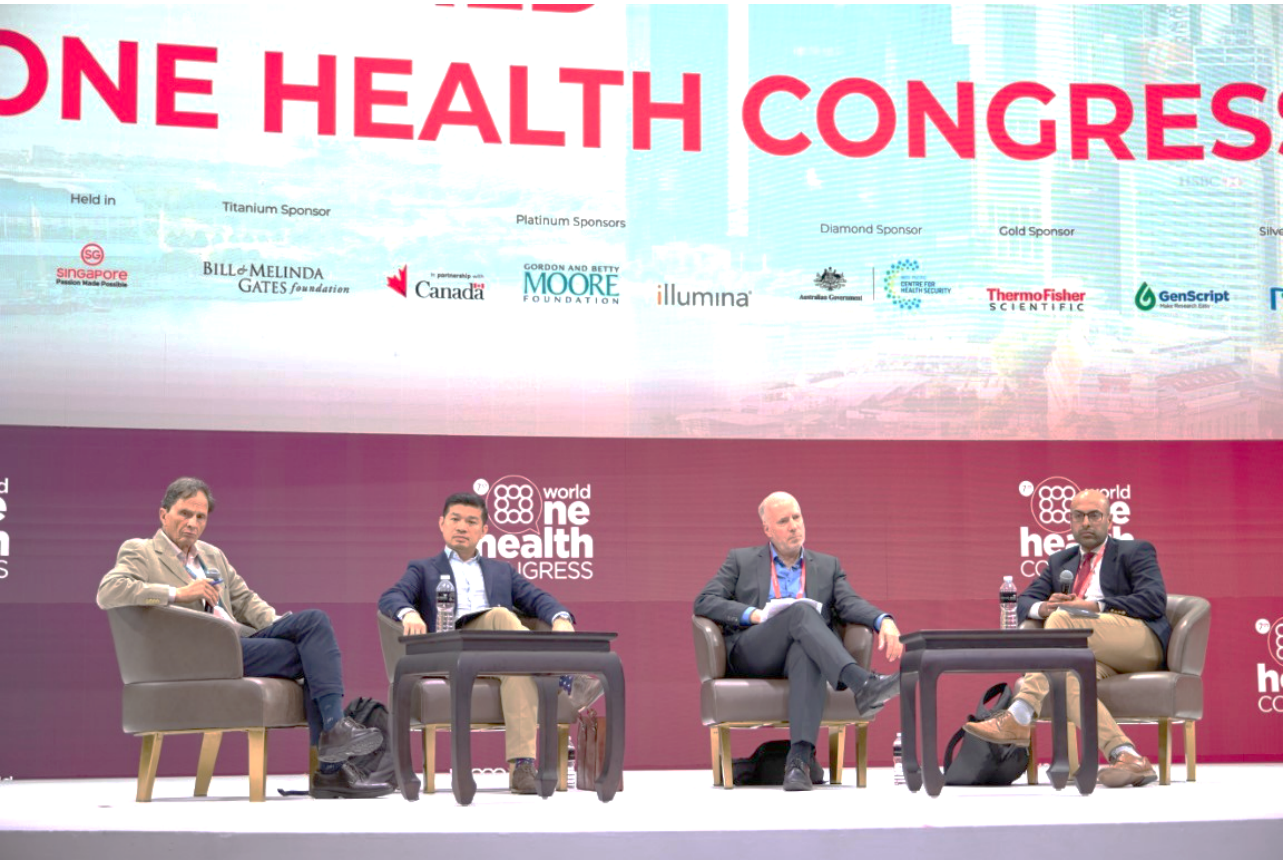
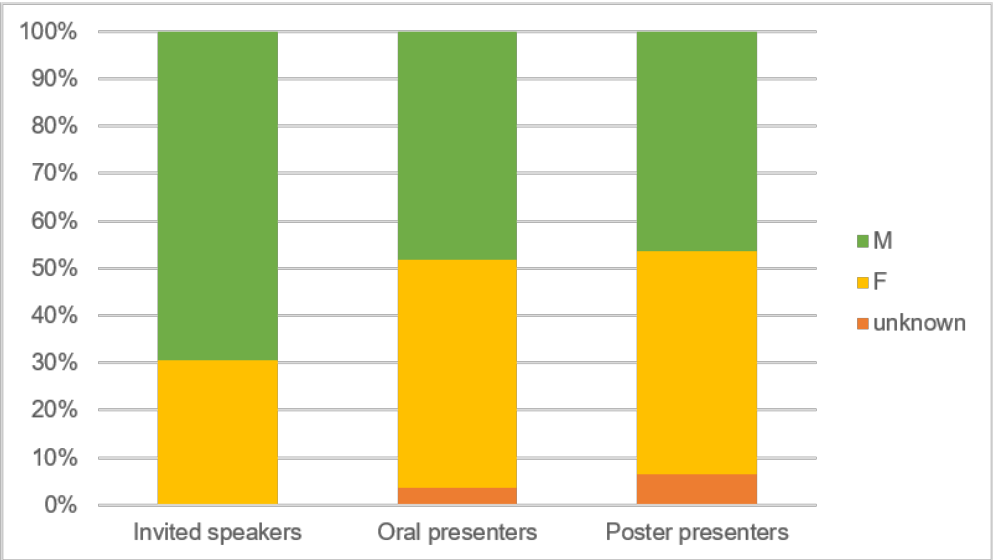


One Health reminds us that the health of people, animals, and ecosystems is interconnected.

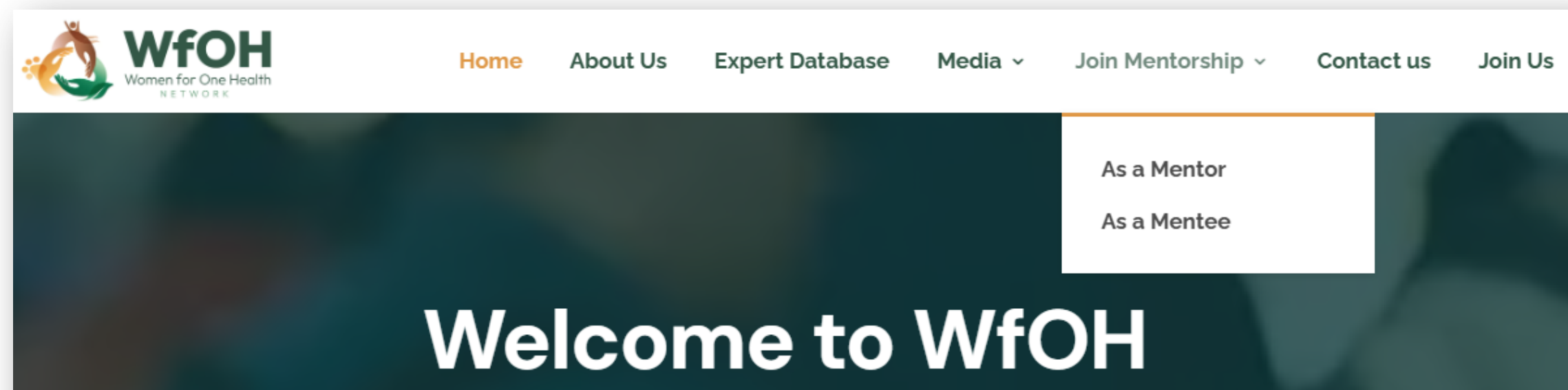
Our goals
